The Great Wall of China - Juyongguan



The Great Wall stretches almost 4,000 miles across China.





Emperor Qin Shi Huang Di (260-210 B.C.E.) conquered and unified China then proceeded to build a great wall to protect the Chinese from the northern barbarians.



Here you can see the modern wiring, lighting and remodeling that has been done to preserve the Great Wall.

It took tens of thousands of workers to build it. Legend has it that many were prisoners and slaves that died and were buried within it. It averages 25' and the watchtowers 40'.
