<p>The Goguryeo-Sui War (598 - 614 C.E.)</p>	<p>This conflict was “a series of campaigns launched by the Sui Dynasty of China against the Goguryeo kingdom of Korea between 598 C.E. and 614 C.E. Goguryeo defeated of Sui, contributing to its eventual downfall of the dynasty in 618.” (New World) This war consisted of four separate battles resulting in numerous defeats for the Chinese. Eventually, the Chinese Emperor, Yangdi, gave up his conquest of Korea. This conflict and internal dissent/uprisings in China led to the downfall of the Sui Dynasty.</p>	<p>N/A. – Not Applicable (Meaning this historical event is all about conflict.)</p>
